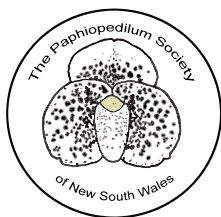

## Craig's suggestions for successful slipper species

Doing these articles, it was always going to get to a point where pretty well all the species benched at a meeting have previously been discussed; well we finally arrived at that point. So where to go and what to talk about? I decided on a species I know that eventually we will see on the bench, I'm sure at the time it eventually happens, the plant will attract a lot of attention. *Paphiopedilum gigantifolium* from section Polyantha is the slipper in question. The name is not an exaggeration, individual leaves can grow to 60cm or even longer, they can obtain an impressive width as well around 12cm. While the flowers don't follow the trend of the of the rest of the plants morphological behaviour, being small in comparison about 10cm wide and having distinctive inward curving petals, and along with *Paph sanderianum* a white ovary. It is reported that up to 14 blooms on a 70cm spike can be achieved, really a plant of amazing proportions?

Remarkably it has not even been 30 year since the species was first found and described in 1997. Braem, Baker & Baker described it in the French Journal "Orchidees" in May 1997, August the same year Ayub Parnata described it as *Paphiopedilum ayubii* in the Australian Orchid Review. He stated that B&B&B's description lacked adequate "Latin diagnosis"? And yet his description reputedly had no Latin diagnosis and no type designation, all apparently required at the time? So B&B&B's description is apparently accepted. Doing the research on this there are two main books I use, and two very specific views on these descriptions??.

Found in the North of Sulawesi near Donggala in the steep shaded ravines at around 700m to 1000m on the limestone cliffs above rivers, it is a warm grower, and I would suggest appreciates lots of air movement and humidity.

I am looking forward to seeing one on the bench in the future.

### DESCRIPTION

Endemic to the island of Sulawesi, the species is a warm growing terrestrial on steep ravines with heavy shade at elevations of 700 to 1000 meters always near running water that blooms in the spring and early summer on an erect, green, densely pubescent inflorescence with successively opening 4 to 6 flowers held well above the leaves.

Named for its extremely large leaves, possibly the largest in the genus.

# SAME, SAME BUT DIFFERENT!

## THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN PAPH. JOHANNA BURKHARDT AND WOSSNER BLACK WINGS By Ken Siew

One of the most desired primary combinations within the Polyantha Section of Paphiopedilum has to be the cross between Paph rothschildianum and Paph adductum. These hybrids typically produce medium to large flowers of a particularly impressive solemnity since most are dark and sombrely formal in appearance.

The hybrid is registered under two names due to the species having two somewhat distinct varieties, var adductum and var anitum. Although the RHS Orchid Hybrid Registry recognises that both these taxa belong to the same species, there is some argument that var anitum is sufficiently distinct to be elevated to species status. The second registration for many is still controversial under the formerly strict guideline for registering new hybrids but it has the virtue of identifying which of the variety of Paph adductum has been used. The same could apply to Paph godefroyae and its variety leucochilum but the horse has truly bolted for that species. Many growers use the grex name Paph Johanna Burkhardt irrespective of breeding since it has precedence even if it is obvious that var anitum has been used.

Both var adductum and var anitum are morphologically similar. The size of plant and flowers, as well as colour are the distinguishing features. Dr Tanaka notes that these days plants of var adductum appear to match those of var anitum in size.

Paph adductum var adductum is found at lower elevation (220m-1000m) in wet tropics exclusively in northern Mindanao. The flowers are varied with green, brown and purple markings. The plants are found in relatively shady conditions.

Paph adductum var anitum is found on other Philippine islands and in Eastern Mindanao (1250m-1350m) south of Sungao. It is characterised by a larger plant and flower size and in the typically dark dorsal sepal which can be almost  $\frac{3}{4}$  to fully black in colour with the striping fusing to produce a matt black blotch. It is reputedly more vigorous, easier of cultivation and cooler tolerant than var adductum.

Paph Johanna Burkhardt was registered in 1994 by Weltz and Paph Wossner Black Wings in 2009 by Glanz using var anitum. Most breeding with Paph adductum

appears to be done with the var anitum as this form appears to be greatly favoured over var adductum. It is also the form which is much more distributed.

The names Paph Johanna Burkhardt and Paph Wossner Black Wings are often used interchangeably. This would not be such a problem if the earlier cross of Paph Johanna Burkhardt used the variety anitum. We do not know if that was the case or if subsequent remakes of crosses are conferred with which particular grex name. It would be useful to keep the grex names specific for each variety since there is demonstrable differences in appearance and cultural requirements between the two varieties which are also evident in their progeny. At the present time, any hybrid with immediate or close relation to Paph adductum would be assumed to have the variety anitum in its breeding if it features a black or partially black blotched dorsal since this feature is dominant, unique and persistent at least to the second generation.

There are many cultivars of Paph Johanna Burkhardt which have been awarded even at the level of FCC by various awarding bodies. Although there are some in which the dorsals show distinct striping, most show the blotched black dorsals of var anitum demonstrating that this is the variety chosen for its more distinctive appearance. The cross between Paph rothschildianum and Paph adductum will continue to be remade, since Paph rothschildianum continues to be "improved" by selective breeding and the market for the cross appears unsated.

This confusing situation where two names are given to a cross on the basis of variety of one or both parents may arise in other crosses. The problem is one of uniformity where both breeders and public are imprecise with usage to the point where the usefulness of two separate names becomes questionable.

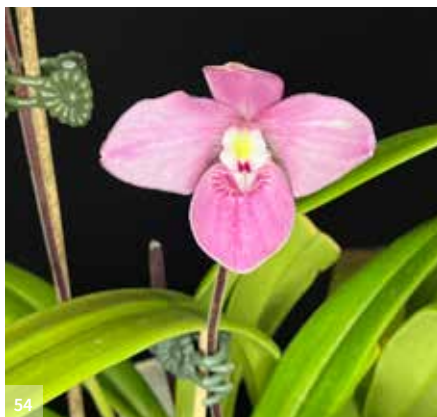

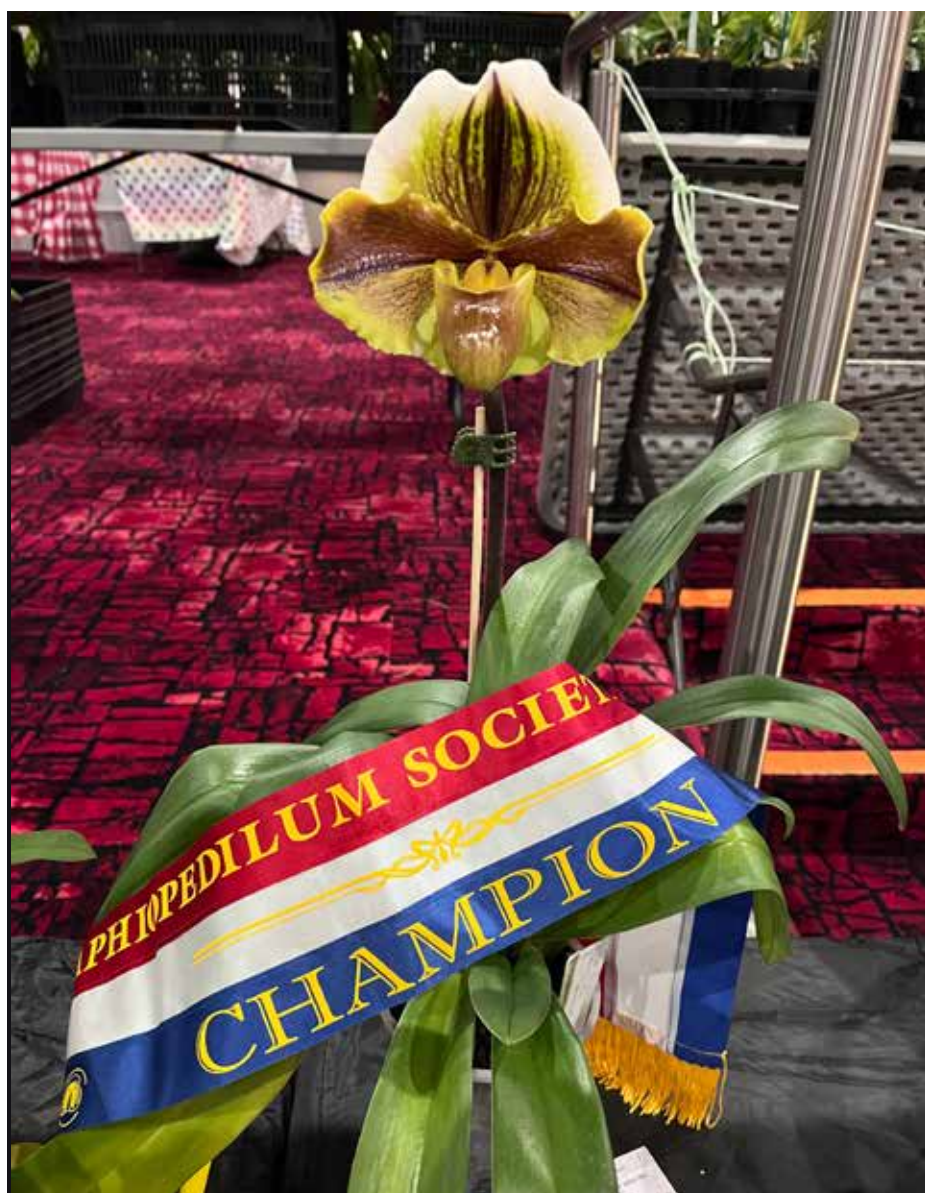
